Curriculum

All students are required to complete 4 English credits, 3 mathematics credits, 2 science credits, 1 biology credit, 4 social studies credits, 2 physical education credits, ½ health credit, 2.4 credits in the Accelerated Reader Program, 1 technology credit and 6 elective credits. Elective credits include courses in the arts, humanities, home economics and others as mandated by the Pennsylvania Department of Education. A minimum of 23 credits are required for graduation.

Juniata High School offers College Preparatory English/Literature, advanced math courses (Calculus, Algebra III/Trigonometry), advanced biology & chemistry, physics, advanced courses in Spanish, and advanced computing. There are currently four Advanced Placement courses available, AP Statistics, AP Calculus, AP English 12, AP US History, and AP Computer Science. There are also dual enrollment courses available for students through Pennsylvania College of Technology.

Curriculum Sequences

Class Periods

Eight periods of forty-three minutes are scheduled daily, five days per week, thirty-six weeks per year. The school operates on a six-day, rotating schedule.

Grading System

Juniata High School students' cumulative numerical averages are weighted and are calculated on all subjects from the beginning of ninth grade. Letter grade values are as follows:

Grade Point Averages are based upon the 100% numerical point system and are calculated by tenths of a percentage (i.e., 90% = 3.5, 90.2% = 3.51, 90.4% = 3.52, etc.)

Class Rankings, Numerical Averages, and Grade Point Averages are computed using all subjects in which a student receives a grade and credit toward graduation.
